Fort Hall, Idaho

The Shoshone-Bannock Tribes of the Fort Hall Reservation have invited Sierra Service Project to live and work on their beautiful reservation for the summer. Fort Hall is located about fifteen miles north of Pocatello in eastern Idaho. There are about 3,500 tribal members living on this very large reservation.

Work

Participants will have the opportunity to build wheelchair ramps for elderly and disabled tribal members. This is a high priority on the reservation as many folks are unable to safely leave their homes.

Accommodations

SSP volunteers will stay at the spacious, local high school which includes a large kitchen, showers and indoor restrooms.

Experience

Sierra Service Project offers high school youth the opportunity to live in community, learn about a different culture, serve and deepen their faith. Youth are challenged to live simply for the week to better understand others and build a sense of community. SSP builds teens' self-esteem through inclusive programming, fun activities and a look at their individual faith.

Project Cost and Dates

Cost: \$335 per participant (\$305 for churches new to SSP!)

Week 1: June 27 – July 3, 2010

Week 2: July 4 – 10, 2010

Week 3: July 11 – 17, 2010
