Chiloquin, OR


In Chiloquin, SSP volunteers will stay at a local school, where volunteers will be housed in a large gym space with on-site showers. Average summer temperatures range from lows in the 40s-50s, and highs in the 80s-90s. We recommend bringing:

	Loose-fitting clothing that allows for airflow (lightweight
	fabrics are best)
\sqcup	Layers for colder mornings and evenings
	Ample sun protection



Del Norte County, CA

In Del Norte County, volunteers will be housed at <u>Crescent City United Methodist Church</u>. Volunteers will stay in various classrooms and the fellowship hall at the church. If needed, RVs (no hookups) may also be accommodated in the parking lot. The Northern California coast is cold, especially compared to other SSP sites. **Average temperatures range from 50-64°F**, with rain possible. We recommend bringing:





Navajo Nation (Tsaile, AZ)

In the Navajo Nation, volunteers will be housed in dorms at <u>Diné</u> <u>College</u>. At high elevations (7,142 feet above sea level) sun exposure is greater and summer can include heavy monsoon rains and thunderstorms. **Average summer temperatures range from 55-85°F.** It can be warm during the day and cooler at night; pack accordingly! We recommend bringing:

☐ Knit hat, scarf, and tall socks (wool recommended)



Raincoat and/or windbreaker
Loose-fitting clothing that allows for airflow (lightweight fabrics are best)
Ample sun protection
